REBOOT FUTURE (RF)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS AGREEMENT

For year 8/1/24 through 7/31/25

- 1. All volunteers must demonstrate professionalism, a high degree of service mindedness, and the spirit of volunteerism. If you are solely interested in awards/certificates/medals, Reboot Future is not for you.
- 2. All volunteering activities must pass the litmus test, "how did my time and efforts positively impact the general community and/or provide educational value to the general community?" For example, tutoring friends or family members fails the litmus test. Tutoring unknown student(s) from a disadvantaged community or school district passes the litmus test.
- 3. Only the hours volunteered at events or organizations that benefit and positively impact the general and broader community will be considered as valid volunteering hours.
- 4. Reboot Future is a private organization and reserves the absolute right to offer, deny, or revoke membership at any time.
- 5. Volunteers must volunteer to all the events organized by Reboot Future.
- 6. Volunteers can volunteer to events organized outside of Reboot Future.
- 7. Hours volunteered outside of Reboot Future are counted only if volunteers volunteer to all the events organized by Reboot Future.
- If members do not meet the requirements of events organized by RF, their membership will be revoked at any time. No awards will be given even if the members volunteer outside of Reboot Future or qualify for Reboot Future or PVSA awards.
- 9. Volunteers must be US Citizens or Legal Permanent Residents (Green Card holders) to be eligible for PVSA recognition.
- 10. For certain types of events outside of RF, a maximum will be imposed. This is to prevent volunteers from succumbing to the "path of least resistance" just to earn hours. For example, online tutoring from the comfort of their home will have a maximum hour limit that can be earned. However, a volunteer who spends hours for Forgotten Harvest, Gleaners etc. outdoors or on physical labor will not face such maximum limits.
- 11. Events volunteered at religious institutions, clubs, societies, etc., must have community impact or educational value to the general public. For example, volunteering at a place of worship to organize and set up a private event or faith based religious observances will not count. Volunteering at a place of worship to organize/set up a food bank event for the general community will count.
- 12. Events organized by RF will not have any limits on the hours that can be earned.
- 13. Students who are part of another organization that is also PVSA certified must declare their affiliation to RF. Volunteers cannot "double dip" their hours. In other words, volunteering for an event on behalf of another PVSA certified organization cannot be counted towards hours earned through RF since RF is also a PVSA certified organization. The volunteer's name will be verified through the PVSA website to identify multiple affiliations.
- 14. Similarly, when volunteering at events outside of RF, volunteers must sign up under Reboot Future to be recognized for hours earned.
- 15. In all instances, Reboot Future reserves the right to deny volunteer hours if it is discovered later that the activities failed to pass the litmus test noted in point 2 above. Volunteers must verify with Reboot Future before attending the event.
